

Jacqueline Burge's Photographs of Plants in Sligo



Jacqueline Burge, a resident of Edgevale Road off Dale Drive, decided to make it a spring and summer project in 1994 to photograph plants in Sligo. She may have recently retired from her work as a computer engineer. All the photos were taken in Jacqueline's section, from Colesville to Forest Glen, and most show flowers with some leaves. Jacqueline placed them in a book in order as the season progressed. Fifteen years later the book was passed from her neighbor, Loetta Vann, to me. The photos were taken without a digital camera or close-up lens, but they are quite close, enough to identify most plants if one is familiar with them.

Below is a list of the plants represented in the book. The list may be of interest in comparing what was definitely present in 1994 with what may be there now. I have relied on general knowledge for the identifications, and if an accurate identification is important a person should check the photo in person. A question mark means uncertainty. Jacqueline's book will be put in the Friends of Sligo Creek Library. The book is good to have, a novel addition to our other plant inventories.

April 6 - 16

Mayapple Lesser Celandine This is the earliest record of lesser celandine in Sligo. Dandelions Gill-over-the-Ground Speedwell, probably Slender Violets, purple and white Violets, purple (pinkish-purple in photo rather than dark violet) Violets, white Violets, yellow Poison Ivy Trout Lily Spring Beauty Garlic Mustard Bloodroot Jack-in-the-Pulpit Star Chickweed

April 16 - 28

Jack-in-the-Pulpit Bellwort, apparently Large-flowered, Uvularia grandiflora, maybe U. sessilifolia Violets, purple (lavender in photo) Dogwood Scilla, or like it, white flowered Scilla, or like it, purple Poison Ivy Sweet Cicely Mayapple Golden Ragwort Star-of-Bethlehem Jacob' s Ladder Japanese Honeysuckle Shrub Autumn Olive Stitchwort ?Winter Cress

April 28 - May 10

Jack-in-the-Pulpit Wild Cherry flowers Kidneyleaf Buttercup Buttercups Jewelweed seedlings Star-of-Bethlehem Daisies Viburnum, a garden escape Solomon' s Seal Greenbrier

May 10 - 18

Indian Strawberry Gill-over-the-Ground Scilla, or like it, purple Grape, not in flower Blackberry Starry False Solomon' s Seal, apparently Solomon's Seal Blue-eyed Grass (Iridaceae), species undetermined Mayapple Rose, probably Multiflora Tulip Popular flowers Rushes Carolina Cranesbill

May 18 - June 3

Poison Ivy Common or Violet Wood Sorrel (not in a mat) Buttercup Jacob's Ladder Bishop's Weed, or Angelica or Alexanders ? Curly Dock Multiflora Rose Willow flower Grape, in flower Starry False Solomon' s Seal Mayapple Japanese Honeysuckle Vine Wineberry Indian Strawberry Yellow Iris Dogbane, perhaps Intermediate Honewort (Jacqueline's identification)

June 3 - 14

Honewort Avens? But leaf is different Poison Ivy, in bud Smartweed Sorrel, a yellow species Dogbane Many-flowered; I don't know this plant. Unknown Walnut Red Clover Onion spp.

June 14 -21

?Loosestrife Has yellow nodding flowers.
Privet
Honewort, apparently
Jewelweed Has 1 orange flower; seems too early, but photo is dated June on the back.
Ox-eye Daisy
Mulberry Berries on twigs that appear deer-eaten
Honewort
Chicory, apparently
Asiatic Dayflower
Shelf fungus
Nettle, stinging?
Common Milkweed
Horse-nettle
Thistle or a knapweed

July 8 - 14

Meadow rue Enchanter's Nightshade Leaf somewhat different Nettle False Nettle, Boehmeria Wineberry Yellow Jewelweed St. Johnswort Water-hemlock Bindweed, white; also pink Chicory Curly Dock White Clover Unknown tree **European** Plantain Blackberry White Vervain Jacob's Ladder

July 14 - 18

Porcelainberry Jewelweed Black Locust

July 21 - 29 A Phlox

Tick-Trefoil (Leaves not visible) Wineberry A Tiger Lily, Lilium sp. Scotch Thistle Nightshade Dodder Unknown

August 6-20

Liriope Unknown Virginia Knotweed Polygonum sp. Unknown A Grass Giant Ragweed? Blue lettuce Milkweed Nightshade Elephant Ears

August 23 - September 1

A milkweed Nightshade Unknown Virginia Dayflower Nightshade Bidens-like yellow composite Three-seeded Mercury Unknown Nettle, possibly False Viburnum, cultivated form Autumn olive Rose of Sharon Jack-in-the-Pulpit, berries Unknown Jewelweed, orange White flower, Nettle-like leaf Primrose Grape, in berry Lambs-quarters Dodder Bidens-like Composite Liriope Non-mushroom fungus Bidens with red stem Mugwort - if so, this is the earliest record Lettuce
