Friends of Sligo Creek, a community non-profit organization dedicated to the ecological health of Sligo Creek and its surrounding watershed, recently had a program meeting via Zoom about the prospect for the return of migratory fish such as herring to Sligo Creek. The speaker was Phong Trieu of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments Anacostia program.

We learned about a potential Army Corps of Engineers project described at <u>https://www.nab.usace.army.mil/Media/News-Releases/Article/1719374/anacostia-</u><u>watershed-restoration-project-plan-in-prince-georges-county-gets-gree/</u> that would remove existing fish blockages in Sligo Creek and the Northwest Branch. We also learned that since the 1990s the Army Corps "focus has intently revolved around ecosystem restoration."
